You are about to enter into a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

This product is an over the counter (OTC) contract – Foreign Exchange Instrument

Term

The maturity of this product is in 12 months. No party is entitled to terminate it unilaterally. Therefore, early termination of the contract is not possible.

Objectives

The purpose of the product is to give the investor the right and obligation to the outcome of the structure according to terms agreed in advance. When the agreement is entered into, the amount, bonus rate, target level and settlement dates are agreed between the parties.

The investor will participate in any price development in the underlying. In other words, the investor will profit if the currency being bought strengthens against the currency being sold, or lose in the event of an opposite development.

The product involves the following cash flows:

The purpose of this product is to sell agreed amounts of one currency (Base Currency), in exchange for the corresponding amounts in another currency (Price Currency), at an agreed fixed rate (bonus Rate) on several specified future dates (Settlement Dates).

On each exercise date the FX spot rate at the fixing time is compared to the bonus rate. If the FX spot rate is less than the bonus rate, the difference between the two rates is added to the cumulative profit of all previous settlement dates.

The transaction will terminate if the maximum hedge amount is reached or exceeded. This happens if the cumulative profit reaches an agreed maximum cumulative profit (Target Level). In that case the product terminates and no further nominal exchange will take place on all following settlement dates. The Key Information Document does not contain information related to your specific trade in the product, and is intended only as an example.
