

Payers Swaption 12 month

Purpose

This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

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You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

Type: OTC - Derivatives contract (OTC means over the counter and indicates that the transaction is not executed on a trading platform).

Term: The maturity date (expiration date) of the product will be agreed upon when entering the Payers Swaption 12 month contract, with the intention of holding the Payers Swaption 12 month until the maturity date.

Objectives:

Purpose: A bought Payers Swaption 12 month can be used to protect against an increasing interest rate.

When you enter into a Payers Swaption 12 month with us some of the elements that are agreed upon are as follows:

- The start and end date of the Payers Swaption 12 month
- The fixed interest rate ('swap rate')
- The start and end date of the potential Interest Rate Swap in the future
- The date and the periods for which the floating interest rate will be fixed
- The notional amount of the potential Interest Rate Swap
- The interest rate which is used as reference ('reference rate')
- The amount of one-off premium which you pay to Rabobank upfront

Method: The Payers Swaption 12 month gives you the opportunity to enter into an Interest Rate Swap on a pre-agreed date. The option gives you the right to receive the market value of the possible underlying Interest Rate Swap at the end date. The most used reference rate index is Euribor. Euribor rates are set and published every day.

This can lead to the following outcomes:

- If the market swap rate on expiration date is higher than the agreed swap rate, an amount will be paid to you if you exercise the option. This amount is equal to the present value of the difference between the market swap rate and the agreed swap rate over the notional and is known as the market value of the Payers Swaption 12 month. Subsequently you have two options:
 - You do not enter into an Interest Rate Swap. You retain the market value which is paid to you.
 - You do enter into an Interest Rate Swap. The market value paid to you can be used to reduce the swap rate of the Interest Rate Swap. It is not an obligation of the Rabobank to offer you an Interest Rate Swap.
- If the market swap rate at end date equals or is lower than the agreed swap rate, no amount will be paid to you and you will have the opportunity to enter into an Interest Rate Swap against the then prevailing market swap rate.

In this Key Information Document we chose for a constant notional during the tenor, the 3 months Euribor as a reference rate and a strike equal to the interest rate of an Interest Rate Swap with the same characteristics (we call this the at-the-money strike).

Return: The difference between the value of the market swap rate and the agreed swap rate in the Payers Swaption 12 month at the end date of the Payers Swaption 12 month minus the premium.

Termination: You can always end the Payers Swaption 12 month unless you have agreed otherwise with Rabobank. For more information on the effects of termination please read the section 'How long should I hold it and can I withdraw money earlier?'. A Payers Swaption 12 month can be unilaterally ended or adjusted by Rabobank. This is only possible in the situations described in the Financial Derivatives Agreement (FDA).

The amounts and other details in this document are used for indicative purposes. The calculations assume a notional amount of EUR 10,000 and a term of 5 years. These details probably differ from the ones in your agreement with Rabobank. The example is for illustrative purposes only.

Intended retail investor:

To make use of this product, you are required to be a Rabobank client and you must have been given access to the product. The product description should be read in advance, so that you understand how this product works and understand the risks. Additionally, we expect

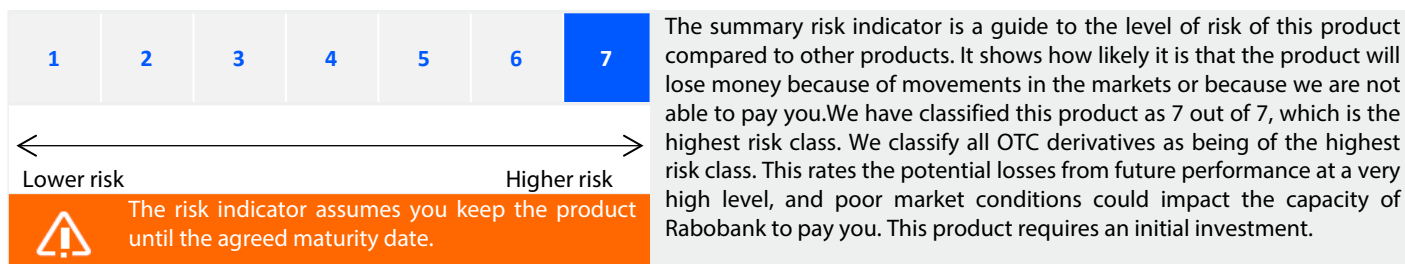
you to understand the concept of hedging risks and how this product can be used for hedging. Moreover, you should understand which factors influence the price of a contract (such as time to expiration, volatility, time value of money and notional amount). You should also understand the basis of currency-, interest rate-, liquidity- and country risk. Furthermore, you should understand how market value is established, and that this product is a bilateral contract between you and Rabobank.

This product must be used for hedging purposes only; you may hedge up to a maximum of 100% of the underlying risk. The maximum time to expiration is three years; a transaction with a time to expiration longer than two years requires approval by Rabobank. With this product you are minimizing currency risk by having the right to buy or sell the notional amount at the predetermined exchange rate and date. As such, you do not profit nor experience negative effects from future exchange rate fluctuations. You may lose 100% of the invested amount; in certain cases you may lose more.

The recommended holding period for the Payers Swaption 12 month is equal to the duration of the underlying risk. In our example we use 5 years for this period.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



In some circumstances you may be required to make further payments to pay for losses. **The total loss you may incur may significantly exceed the amount invested.** This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could incur significant losses. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could incur significant losses.

Performance scenarios

What you will get from this product depends on future market performance. Market developments in the future are uncertain and cannot be accurately predicted. The scenarios shown are illustrations based on results from the past and on certain assumptions. Markets could develop very differently in the future.

* The potential return is calculated as the net profit or loss as a percentage over the notional amount.

The figures shown include all the costs of the product itself, but may not include all the costs that you pay to your advisor or distributor. The figures do not take into account your personal tax situation, which may also affect how much you get back. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances.

What happens if Rabobank is unable to pay out?

When Rabobank is not able to meet its obligations, the payments to be made by Rabobank are not covered by the Dutch Investor Compensation Scheme (beleggerscompensatiestelsel) or any other government or private protection scheme or guarantee. This means you could incur a significant loss.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest and how long you hold the product. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods. We have assumed:

- Recommended Holding Period: 5 years

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.
- 10,000 EUR is invested.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

In our example we use 5 years for this period. The Payers Swaption 12 month is intended to hold until the end date in order to hedge the currency risk. The end date will be agreed with you.

The product cannot be ended; however, you can always enter an opposite transaction. By doing this you enter a new opposite transaction. The tenor of this new transaction equals the remaining term of the original transaction.
